A love of the colour teal was the starting point for the ensuite in this renovated home in inner-city Melbourne. Designer Frances Cosway of White Pebble Interiors chose this shade for the vanity and set it front and centre in the room to the great delight of the homeowner. “This is a bathroom designed just for them,” she says. As there is a bath in the family bathroom, there was no need to include another here, allowing for a luxuriously large shower at one end of the room. The punchy teal vanity is complemented by a backdrop of cool grey tones that comply with the owners’ request for a sophisticated, gender-neutral space. The textured wall tiles lend a slightly industrial aesthetic and provide the point of difference they were seeking.

What was the brief for this space? The owners wanted lots of storage and a large space to be comfortable in, with a simple, sophisticated palette incorporating teal, grey and unique materials.
